

Breast cancer affects 1 in 8 US women in their lifetime. Mammograms (breast checks), like those offered by Project PINK and Project PINK Plus, help find breast cancer early when the chances of survival are highest.



Are you an uninsured woman age 40 or older? If so, we encourage you to take part in a free Project PINK screening mammogram.

To take part, you must:

- Be a resident of Mecklenburg/Union County
- Have a primary care doctor
- Not be enrolled in Medicare or Medicaid
- Not have had a mammogram in the past year
- Not be pregnant or breastfeeding
- Not have any new breast lumps or concerns

If you're able to participate, the following is paid for through this program:

- A screening mammogram performed by Charlotte Radiology at Levine Cancer Institute's Project PINK screening day
- One follow-up diagnostic exam (if needed), performed within one year of screening
- Biopsy* (if needed), to confirm a cancerous or non-cancerous diagnosis following an abnormal diagnostic mammogram





Do you have a breast health concern or problem? If so, we encourage you to take part in a free Project PINK Plus diagnostic mammogram (a more in-depth breast exam).

To take part, you must:

- Have one or more of the following breast concerns (no age requirement):
 - A worrisome lump
 - New changes in the breast skin, such as dimpling, hardening, rash, inverted nipple
 - Nipple discharge
 - Question of infection or inflammation
- Live in Mecklenburg County
- Be uninsured
- Have a primary care provider and physician order for diagnostic exam

If you're able to participate, the following is paid for through this program:

- A diagnostic mammogram, including ultrasound (if needed)
- Biopsy* (if needed), to confirm a cancerous or non-cancerous diagnosis

*Important! You must find out if you qualify for the Health Department's Breast and Cervical Cancer Control Program (BCCCP) before your biopsy, to stay in the Project PINK program. If you enroll in BCCCP before your diagnosis, you may apply for Breast and Cervical Cancer Medicaid to cover your treatment if you are diagnosed.
