ALL ABOUT UNDERSTANDING

All About Understanding is a 501c3 non-profit organization. We began our journey in 2020 with a mission to ENCOURAGE the youth to understand themselves by teaching them to "Know yourself, Be yourself", MENTOR the youth in the necessary life skills to be successful, and MOTIVATE the youth to be the best version of themselves. As we bridge the gap between the traditional classroom setting and "real-life" situations, our goal is to help them envision their goals by creating refreshing and enriching ideas and programs intended to uplift their minds and spirits, build self-confidence, and encourage possession of a mentality that anything is achievable. Through our "Community Collaboration Initiative" we remain committed to assisting the youth and their families with the resources they need to be successful in and outside of the home. Although we target youth ages 12-25, our platform is designed to use that age group to set an example for those younger than age 12, while simultaneously giving the older generation hope for the future.

CASA OF SOUTHWEST OKLAHOMA

Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) are trained community volunteers who are appointed by a judge to represent, watch over, and advocate for abused and neglected children to help ensure they don't get lost in an overburdened system or languish in foster care. The CASA researches the case, meets with the child regularly, monitors the family's progress, and makes recommendations to the court based on what they believe to be in the child's best interests - this may be recommendations for medical assistance, mental or physical therapy, educational services, or a pathway to finding a loving, permanent home. CASAs not only fulfill the vital role of child advocate in the courtroom setting; they also provide a consistent source of emotional support to these children by remaining on each case as long as it remains open, which may be months or years. CASAs are often the one constant adult presence in a foster child's life and, in 2019, 1,395 CASA volunteers served 3,693 abused and neglected children state-wide in Oklahoma.

THE CENTER FOR CREATIVE LIVING

The Center for Creative Living (CCL) is a local senior citizens center providing quality service and a safe, welcoming environment to seniors, every weekday. The CCL maintains classes that have been taught for many years. The CCL emphasizes prevention of

fraud, abuse, and neglect for the elderly. Over the past several years other health, wellness, and educational classes have been added to the daily schedule, including the Senior Nutrition Program. The Senior Nutrition Program provides a lunch time food service, including home delivered meals to home-bound senior citizens. Program activities encourage (1) physical wellness through exercise classes, nutrition program, health symposiums and screenings, and classes on nutrition and diet; (2) emotional social wellness through computer classes, social events, guilting, grief support group, Phone Alert League PAL contacts; and (3) intellectual wellness through AARP classes and services, fraud and abuse detection and prevention, travel, literacy, re-training, and webinars that cover topics such as health, Medicare Medicaid, retirement and more. Without CCL there would be increased rates of isolation, depression, injury, illness, and early death among our senior citizens. The CCL is a critical component in the aging continuum of care and fills an important need for area seniors. Active, healthy aging not only benefits individuals, but communities as well. Active seniors are more engaged, volunteer more, and generally add value to the overall fabric of a thriving community.

COMANCHE COUNTY MEMORIAL HOSPITAL - NURSE EDUCATION FUND

The Comanche County Memorial Hospital Nursing program allows us to offer growth to our own nurses right here at home in Southwest Oklahoma. Here in Oklahoma there is an 11.2 RN to 1000 patient ratio. With the nursing shortage at an all time high, it is vital that we at CCMH are able to provide quality learning opportunities for future nurses. As medical research findings change, so does the necessary education.
