Father's Day Becomes A Holiday




Many of us associate the month of June with Father's Day, but this hasn't always been so. Cultures have celebrated the role fathers play throughout history, but our modern American celebrations date back to 1909 in the city of Spokane, Washington, when a woman by the name of Sonora Smart Dodd brought forth the idea of a day to honor fathers (the first official Mother's Day celebration took place a year earlier in 1908). This idea occurred to Dodd while she was attending a Mother's Day sermon and was motivated by her admiration of her father, who raised her and her siblings as a single

parent. Although it took decades — and some pushback from the public — Father's Day was increasingly embraced by American presidents and communities across the country until it was officially established as a holiday by President Richard Nixon in 1972.
