I am writing this for my best friend Celine, mother of two, who is currently living with a mother's biggest fear. That her child has cancer. The summer of 2018, her youngest child, Jordan (2yo girl) would sporadically start crying or limping on her leg for unknown reason and all we could think is maybe she fell or growing pains or pinched nerve or something. Being that her child just barley turned two in June 2018, she wasn't verbal enough to tell her mother what she actual felt or what was wrong. Celine scheduled an appointment for her to be seen, they took x-rays and blood test but everything came back normal and couldn't find a cause of what could be causing her to cry or feel hurt in her leg. As weeks went on, the same thing kept occurring, and still concerned, Celine had her reevaluated two different times and they still couldn't find an answer. She was frustrated and felt defeated knowing her little girl wasn't ok and that no one could give her a definite answer, she ordered that the hospital do an MRI on her. Once Celine received the MRI results, she was devastated. She learned that all this time that her 2vo had a 6.3cm cancerous tumor in her upper spinal column and was described by the doctors as a very rare type of cancer in such a small child. They explained to Celine that her daughter would need surgery immediately to attempt to remove the tumor and to have the family prepare for lifelong consequences including her ability to be able to eat and breathe on her own.
