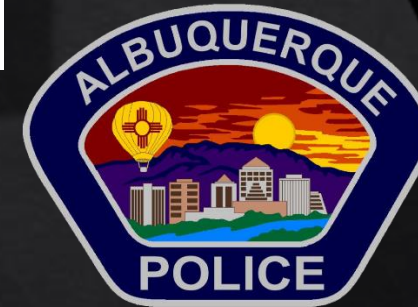

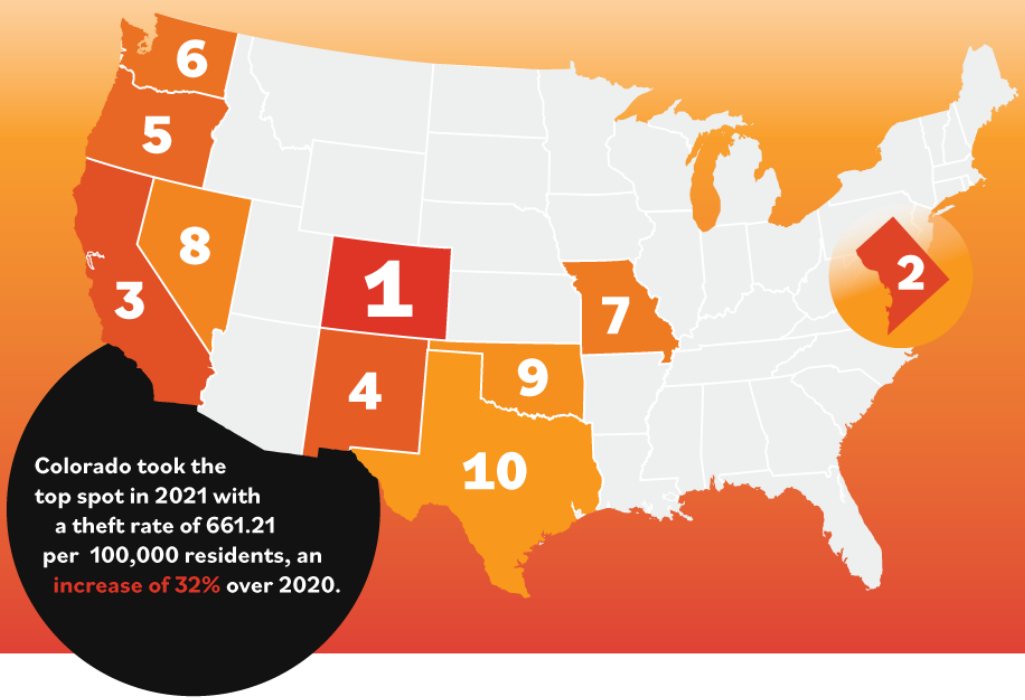

5	Oregon	471.16

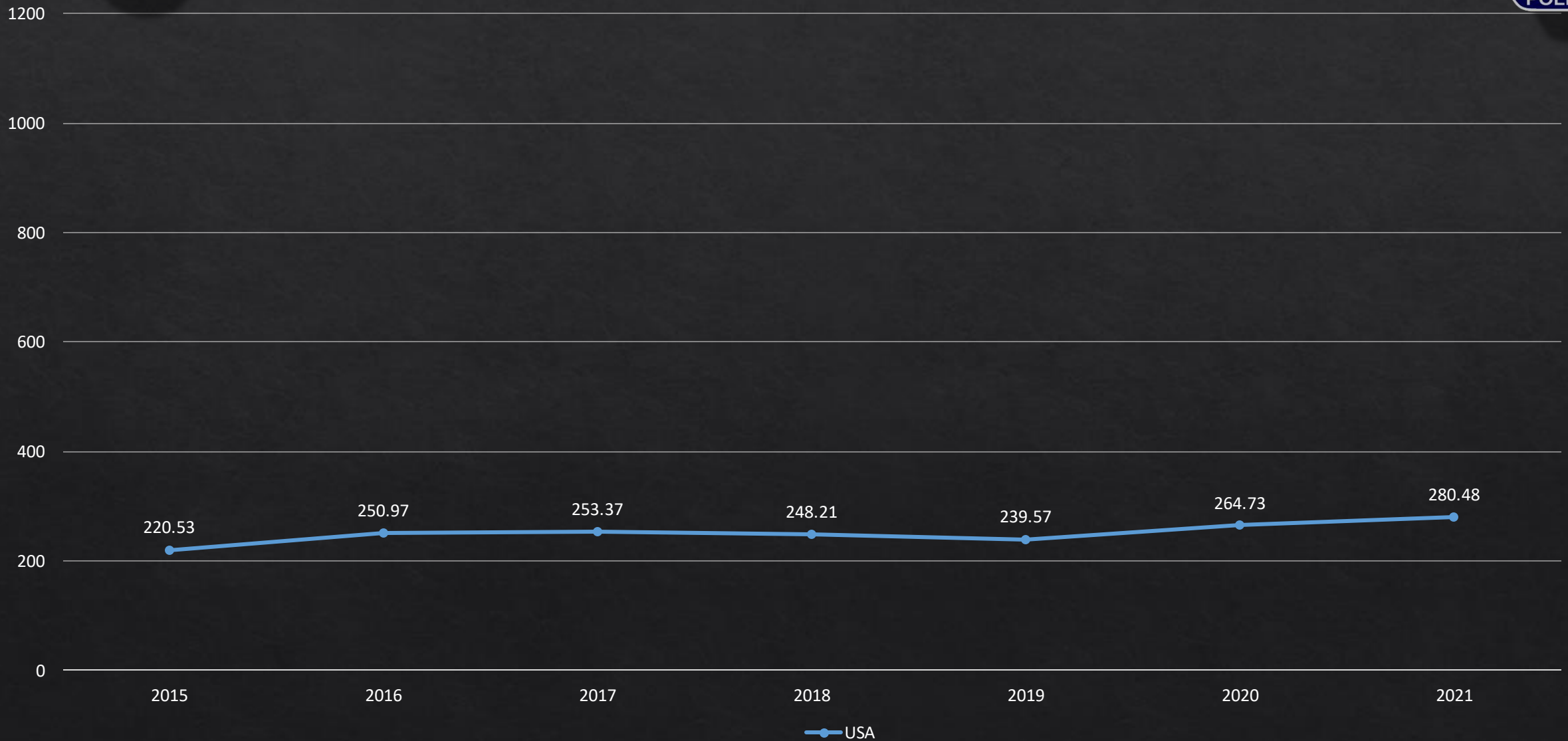

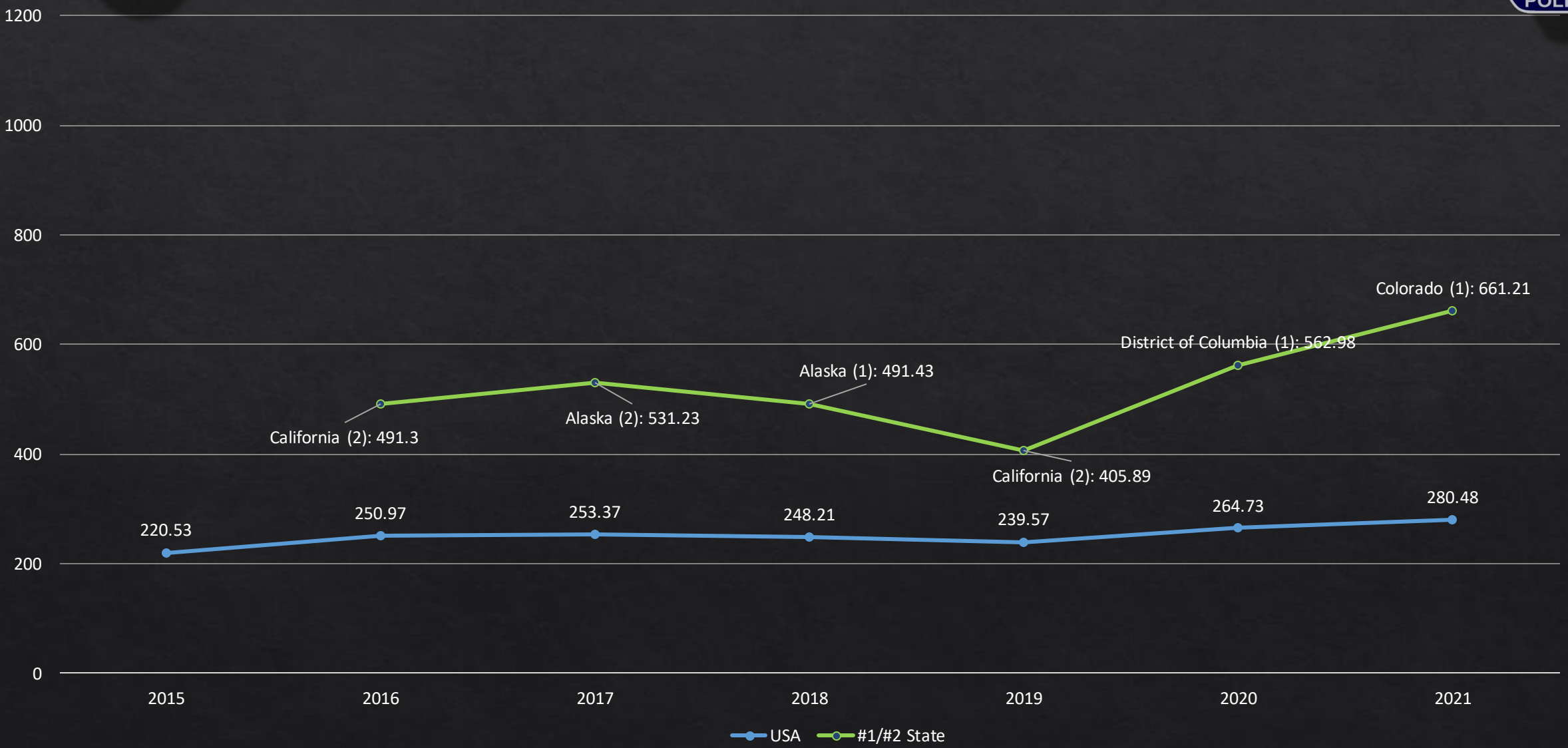

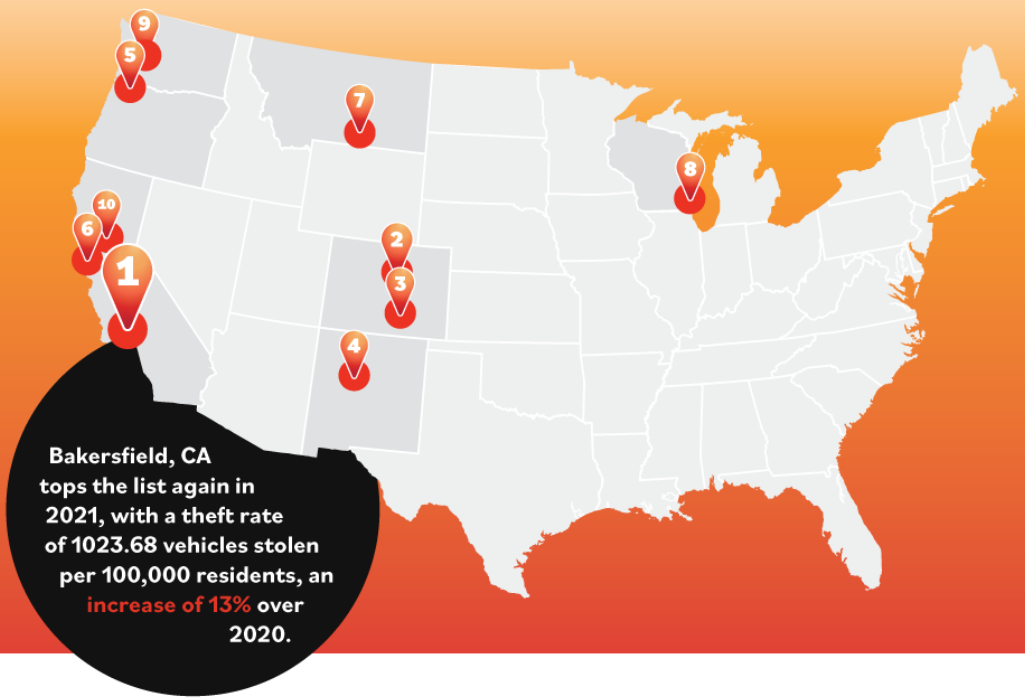




AUTO THEFT IN NEW MEXICO

2021 *HOT SPOTS* FOR VEHICLE THEFT BY THEFT RATE

In 2021, these Core-Based Statistical Areas (CBSAs)/Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSAs) had the highest rates of vehicle theft per 100,000 residents:

NM AUTO THEFT PREVENTION AUTHORITY



- ◇ Supervising Board of Directors made up of Superintendent of Insurance, AODA Director, 2 LEA reps, 4 insurance industry reps, 1 at large member
- ◇ **Empowered** to solicit, review and approve grants to support auto theft education, prevention, investigation, and prosecution efforts
- ◇ Act as clearinghouse for auto theft-related intelligence
- ◇ Gave OSI statewide jurisdiction to investigate/prosecute auto theft-related cases
- ◇ Emergency Clause gave immediate effect

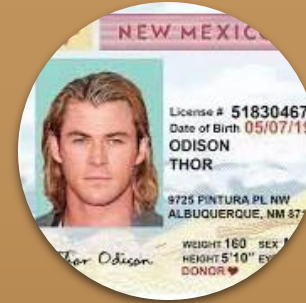

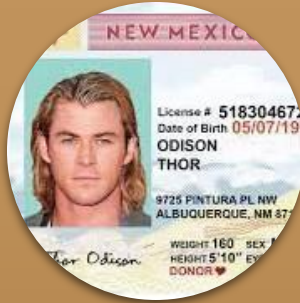

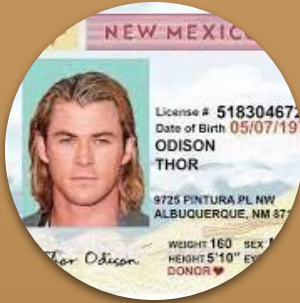
