Dear Gregory,

It is an honor for me to share that since its creation, the *Chancellor's Fund of Teaching Excellence and Student Success* (CFTESS) has raised \$110,765. The CFTESS has provided vital resources for faculty and staff professional development when budget cuts, beginning in 2015-2016, eliminated the System contribution to UW-Stout for this purpose. Your support truly impacts our ability to recruit and retain outstanding faculty and staff, which in turn, allows us to continue to offer an exceptional, career-focused education for our students.


During 2016-2017, the CFTESS provided \$20,000 of additional funding for faculty and staff professional development. This was about 1/3 of the total amount that was available for professional development last year. Because of this funding, we were able to support 91% of the proposals that were submitted to the review committee.

Here are a few examples of how your gift impacted the faculty and staff at UW-Stout:

- Heather Stecklein, University Archivist, attend a conference that changed her approach to how to work with departments and programs on managing and archiving records.
- Douglas Whitaker from the Mathematics, Statistics & Computer Science Department, attended a conference which expanded his knowledge of a new assessment required for students to be licensed to teach Mathematics in Wisconsin. He also developed a network of fellow educators which will be helpful in ensuring that he is up-to-date with best practices in assisting students in passing the certification requirements and becoming strong educators.
- Julie Beston, a Biology professor, met a person involved with iNaturalist, an application that allows for uploading pictures of plants and animals to a website for identification by experts. She is planning to develop new laboratory exercises based on this technology.

This next year, we are looking to use an additional \$20,000 from the CFTESS to provide opportunities for faculty and staff to attend and/or present at professional conferences, conduct research and expand their knowledge of industry trends, emerging technology and teaching methods. Thank you again for your partnership with the *Chancellor's Fund of Teaching Excellence and Student Success*.
