

Tens of thousands of enthusiastic bidders and fans brought big energy from the moment the gates opened on Super Saturday, presented by Gila River Resorts & Casinos, at Barrett-Jackson's 2025 Scottsdale Auction on Saturday, Jan. 25. Day 8 delivered an electrifying experience filled with supercharged excitement through the sale of two extraordinary charity vehicles that raised a combined \$5.2 million for worthy causes, as well as hundreds of unparalleled collector cars and authentic automobilia.

Among the memorable moments that had the crowd in the arena erupting in applause was the charity sale of the first retail production 2025 Chevrolet Corvette ZR1, VIN 001 (Lot #3005). This landmark vehicle sold for an impressive \$3.7 million, with 100% of the hammer price benefiting the American Red Cross. Unsurprisingly, Rick Hendrick – Corvette aficionado, championship-caliber NASCAR Cup Series team owner, and the man at the helm of Hendrick Automotive Group – will be the one to take that Vette home.

Corvette Chief Engineer Josh Holder joined Barrett-Jackson Chairman and CEO Craig Jackson and President Steve Davis onstage for this momentous occasion, sharing that the funds will provide critical aid to those affected by the California wildfires and hurricanes in the southeastern United States. The winning bidder, NASCAR team owner Rick Hendrick, was honored for his legacy of



24 Hours of Daytona Winners...

The Porsche Penske Motorsport #7 car successfully defended its 24 Hours of Daytona victory in the 2025 running of the race, claiming a 20th win at the event for Porsche in dominant fashion as it led over half of the laps in the event.

Ford and Chevrolet

Two of America's biggest brands delivered in America's biggest sportscar race as Ford Multimatic (Mustang GT3) and AWA (Chevrolet Corvette Z06 GT3.R) came out victorious in GTD Pro and GTD respectively.

Both classes produced epic, door-to-door racing throughout but especially when the heat was turned up in the final laps. Christopher Mies, Dennis Olsen and Frédéric Vervisch gave this iteration of Mustang its first victory by 1.9s, while Matt Bell, Orey Fidani, Lars Kern and Marvin Kirchhöfer handed Chevrolet its 21st victory in this event by 1.5s. Corvette at 24 Hours of Daytona....

Throughout 24 hours of racing, emotions are bound to run hot. Just ask Tommy Milner of Corvette Racing. Milner, one of the drivers co-piloting the No. 4 Corvette Z06 GT3.R at the had a



heated exchange with some BMW drivers while battling for the lead – and he made his frustration crystal clear by flipping them off at race speed.

Milner found himself in a fierce fight for the lead of the GTD Pro class against the No. 1 BMW, driven by Kelvin van der Linde of Paul Miller Racing at the time of the incident. The duo took their battle through slower traffic and lapped cars in front of them, one of which was the No. 48 BMW of Augusto Farfus, none other than van der Linde's teammate. Farfus, over 50 laps down, did his utmost to stall Milner's charge, throwing blocks left and right and backing the No. 4 Corvette Racing machine into the clutches of van der Linde.

Officials cracked down on Farfus, sending him for a drive-through penalty for impeding the leaders. When he returned to the track, though, Farfus continued to wield the No. 48 BMW against Milner's Vette, and the two got stacked up heading into a corner. Milner drifted high and made contact with van der Linde. The No. 4 Corvette suffered damage, tearing out its left taillight. Farfus was handed another drive through penalty, and Milner sent him off with his middle finger flying high out the window of his Corvette.

The damage wasn't immense, but it was enough to take the No. 4 Corvette Racing team out of contention for the lead as they made multiple pit stops to fix it.

The saga didn't end there, though. Later in the race, Nico Varrone, now at the helm of the No. 4 Vette, got sweet, sweet payback. As the No. 1 BMW closed on Varrone's teammate, the No. 3 Vette, for third place, Varrone saw his chance and divebombed his rival. The BMW went for a neat little spin as both bright yellow Corvette Racing teammates carried on their way. The No. 4 Vette wound up seventh in the GTD Pro Class while the No.3 Vette chased the Ford across the line and finished second. The No. 1 BMW, meanwhile, was relegated to fourth.

GM Cutting More Jobs....

GM has reportedly cut more jobs, targeting underperforming employees through the automaker's revamped annual performance evaluation system. Affected workers were notified last Friday. The updated evaluation



system was introduced in August 2024, and aims to not only weed out under-performers, but also reward top performers.

According to a report from Detroit Free Press, dozen of workers were let go in the recent round of layoffs, with some of the workers suspecting the move following earlier performance reviews, and others surprised they were let go. The performance reviews are slated to continue through February, with additional layoffs on the way.

The updated evaluation framework transitions from a three-point to a five-point rating scale, designed to categorize employees into one of five groups:

- 5 percent significantly exceeding expectations (top performers)
- 10 percent exceeding expectations (high performers)
- 70 percent meeting expectations (middle-of-the-road performers)
- 10percent partially meeting expectations (low performers)
- 5 percent not meeting expectations (worst performers)

Employees ranked in the bottom 5 percent face termination and are ineligible to reapply for future roles at GM. Additionally, employee bonuses are tied to performance, with top performers receiving 150 percent of the standard bonus, high performers receiving 125 percent of the standard bonus, middle-of-the-road performers receiving 100 percent of the standard bonus, low performers receiving 50 percent of the standard bonus, and the worst performers receiving no bonus.

Back in November, GM laid off approximately 1,000 employees, primarily in the U.S., citing the need for efficiency and competitiveness. Many workers were notified via email, leading to some controversy. A GM spokesperson stated that these changes aim to foster a culture of high performance and collaboration. Several months prior in August, GM terminated more than 1000 software and service workers, many of which worked at the automaker's Global Technical Center in Warren, Michigan.

GM Record Profit Sharing for UAW Workers....

GM has issued its quarterly letter to shareholders for Q4 of the 2024 calendar year, highlighting the automaker's annual performance, providing strategic insights, and laying out expectations for the future. Among the headlines were record profit sharing for employees, with up to \$14,500 per employee in bonuses. GM also states that investors earned



a 50 percent total return, with fewer than 1 billion shares outstanding by the end of the year.

"I'm pleased to share that our global salaried team has earned strong performance bonuses, and our U.S. hourly employees once again earned the industry's highest profit sharing, totaling more than \$640 million," writes GM CEO Mary Barra. "That's a record payout of up to \$14,500 per person, equal to more than two months of extra pay on average for our UAW-represented team."

The record profit sharing is on the back of significant growth in 2024, with a nine percent increase in full-year revenue and record-breaking performance in EBIT-adjusted, adjusted automotive free cash flow, and adjusted EPS-diluted. GM also grew its U.S. market share and led across total, retail, and fleet deliveries. In addition to these achievements, GM doubled its EV market share and reported profitability in its EV portfolio by the fourth quarter of 2024. Operations in China also improved, with positive equity income reported before restructuring costs.

The General also highlighted other important bullet points in the company's strategy, including plans to launch three new Cadillac EV models in 2025, including the Escalade IQ, Optiq and Vistq. In addition, GM aims to sustain its strong performance by leveraging several new gas-powered SUVs, including the Chevy Equinox, Chevy Traverse and the GMC Acadia, all while addressing regulatory and market uncertainty to maintain competitiveness across both its ICE and EV portfolios.

"Of course, there is uncertainty over trade, tax, and environmental regulations and we have been proactive with Congress and the administration," Barra writes. "In our conversations, we have stressed the importance of a strong manufacturing sector and American leadership in advanced technologies. It's clear that we share a lot of common ground, and we appreciate the dialogue."

NHTSA Opens Investigation into GM Engines....

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) opened an investigation on Thursday into GM for engine failure in some full-size trucks and SUVs. The investigation applies to the 6.2L V8 L87 and involves trucks and SUVs from Chevy, GMC and



Cadillac equipped with this engine from the 2019-2024 model years, which the NHTSA estimates comprise 877,710 vehicles.

The investigation stems from 39 complaints reported to the NHTSA's Office of Defects Investigation (ODI). "The complainants report a bearing failure that may result in either engine seizure or breaching of the engine block by the connecting rod," the NHTSA report says. "The complainants report that there is no detectability prior to the failure."

This defect poses a safety risk, prompting the NHTSA to open this investigation. No crashes, fires, injuries, or fatalities have been reported in connection with the engine failures.

The following General Motors models are potentially affected by the investigation:

- 2019-2024 Chevy Silverado 1500
- 2021-2024 Chevy Tahoe
- 2021-2024 Chevy Suburban
- 2019-2024 GMC Sierra 1500
- 2021-2024 GMC Yukon/Yukon XL
- 2021-2024 Cadillac Escalade/ Escalade ESV

The NHTSA's Preliminary Evaluation (PE) is in the early stages of

determining the scope and severity of the problem. Right now, owners need only continue regular maintenance of their trucks and SUVs.

GM Stock Value Plummets 8.25%....

The value of GM stock decreased during the week of January 27th, 2025 to January 31st, 2025. Shares closed the week at \$49.46 per share, representing a decrease of \$4.45 per share, or 8.25 percent compared to the previous week's closing value of \$53.91 per share.



By comparison, shares of GM's crosstown rival, Ford Motor Company, were stable, falling just 0.40 percent, or \$0.04 per share, during the same timeframe.

GM stock value declined this week after several weeks of gains.

Some of the biggest factors affecting GM stock value this week was the announcement of Q4 2024 earnings and updated guidance for 2025, which, to some analysts, does not provide a cushion for possible tariffs implemented under President Trump, or fluctuating demand and government support for EVs. U.S. Transportation Secretary Sean Duffy has directed the NHTSA to reconsider fuel economy rules covering new vehicles produced through 2031 model years.

General Motors continues to drive towards the mass adoption of allelectric vehicles, laying out its ambitious global future growth strategy in 2022 and once again reaffirming its commitment to deploying zeroemission and autonomous technologies around the world.

Outside the U.S., GM has announced a \$1.4B investment for Brazil, the largest and most commercially strategic country in South America.

Finally, The General is also cutting its workforce in China, while a new President has been appointed at the SAIC-GM joint venture amid a restructuring effort. The automaker previously announced that sales figures for its GM China operations dropped 21%.

GM has also announced that it is moving its global headquarters to the new Hudson's Detroit development in downtown, while GM CEO Mary Barra has expressed confidence that a solution will be found for the GM Renaissance Center the automaker will vacate next year



Newly Discovered Asteroid or???

Elon Musk's sense of humor is out of this world.

Seven years after the SpaceX CEO launched a Tesla Roadster into orbit, astronomers from the Minor Planet Center at the Harvard-S mithsonian Center for Astrophysics in Massachusetts



confused it with an asteroid earlier this month.

A day after the astronomers with the Minor Planet Center registered 2018 CN41, it was deleted on Jan. 3 when they revealed that it was in fact Musk's roadster.

The center said on its website that 2018 CN41's registry was deleted after "it was pointed out the orbit matches an artificial object, 2018-017A, Falcon Heavy Upper stage with the Tesla Roadster. The designation 2018 CN41 is being deleted and will be listed as omitted."

SpaceX launched the Tesla Roadster on the maiden flight of SpaceX's huge Falcon Heavy rocket in February 2018.

The roadster was expected to go into elliptical orbit around the sun, going a little beyond Mars and back toward Earth, but it apparently exceeded the orbit of Mars and kept going to the asteroid belt, according to Musk at the time.

When the roadster was mistaken for an asteroid earlier this month, it

was less than 150,000 miles from Earth, which is closer than the moon's orbit, according to Astronomy Magazine, meaning that astronomers would want to monitor how close it gets to Earth.
