

# Palm Springs Collector Car Auctions

McCormick's Palm Springs Collector Car Auction #77 is just a few weeks away, taking place November 22-24, 2024 at The Palm Springs Convention Center Outdoor Event area. Nearly 500 cars for collectors of all tastes are set to hit the block, ranging from a 1928 Ford Model A Pickup to a 2004 Ferrari 360 Spider.

Here's a few of the stars...



# Intro

Recently Hagerty published an article about the depreciation rate of the C7 compared to the C8. And that got us thinking. If we jumped ahead 30 years into the future what Corvette generation will be more sought after by collectors, the C7 or C8? None of us have a crystal ball so we can only make some



educated guesses at what collectors in 2054 may want in their classic Corvette. At that point the Corvette will have recently celebrated its 100th anniversary and will probably be in the middle of the C12 generation. By that time the normal depreciation trends of both the C7 and C8 cars will be past. So, the value in 30 years is going to be driven by collectability. What generation will stoke the fires of Corvette fans more in the future?

We list 5 reasons why we think the C7 will come out on top and 5 reasons why we think the C8 will fare better. Which generation do you think will be more valuable overall 30 years from now?

# C7 Reason #1 – Last Front Engine Model

From 1953 until 2019, the Corvette featured a traditional front-engine, rear-wheel drive layout. Because of that nearly 70-year run, many people consider that layout the true Corvette layout. A classic Corvette should have an engine in the front. A mid-engine layout might be fine for the likes of Porsche and Ferrari, but the American sports car should have the engine in the nose. The C7 is the last Corvette you can buy with this layout. It is unlikely that GM will ever go back to making a front-engine Corvette. That could make the C7 more sought after by collectors 30 years from now, resulting in higher prices.

# C8 Reason #1 – First Mid-Engine Model

If the C7 may be more valuable because it was the last front-engine Corvette, then it is



possible that the opposite could be true. The C8 is the first generation with the engine in the middle. Something that Zora Arkus-Duntov himself wanted for decades. It finally happened with the 2020 C8 Stingray. This will be the path forward for the Corvette in the foreseeable future. Collectors love to get their hands on the first of anything, and that bodes well for C8 values in the year 2054.

# C7 Reason #2 – Last Manual Transmission

This is an interesting one. Today, there is a movement among auto enthusiasts to save the manual transmission. A lot of folks hate the fact that the C8 comes with an automatic only. In the collector car world today, manual transmission cars almost always bring more money than equivalent automatic cars. So, with that in mind, the C7 could be more sought after by collectors. But it does come with a caveat.

Many people today can't drive a manual transmission. And with EVs and the general erosion of manual transmission cars being offered today, we suspect that the number of people that can drive a manual in 2054 will be far less than today. A person born today will not be of driving age until the year 2040. How many new manual transmission cars will be available in 2040? This may be a dying technology that future collectors have no interest in. How many people today are more interested in collectible cars that are started with a hand crank?

# **C8 Reason #2 – Next Level Performance**

While some may lament the loss of the manual transmission and the move to a mid-engine layout, there is no question that the C8 is a better performer than the C7. And it is not really close. In 2054 when the C12 Corvette is a fully electric model that can go from 0 to 60 mph in 1 second, the C7 will be outclassed. In fairness, so will the C8, but the C8 is going to be a lot closer to modern performance levels. That can be appealing to future collectors.

# C7 Reason #3 - ZR1 Rarity

The 2025 ZR1 is a moonshot of a Corvette. It will be expensive, and hard to get. But GM has said that it will not be a limited model. They will make as many as they can. The C7 ZR1 was only made for a single model year. It will likely be far rarer than the C8 ZR1. And the C7 ZR1 has the engine in the front and is available with a manual transmission. All the things that future collectors may be looking for.

# C8 Reason #3 – Special Engines (LT6/LT7)

The C8 generation has a couple of engines that are likely never going to be replicated in any future generation. The wonderful flat-plane crank LT6 in the C8 Z06, and the insanely powerful LT7 in the C8 ZR1. There will almost certainly be more powerful Corvette engines in the future. But they will be electrified units. If collectors are looking for the most special pre-electrification powerplants, they will want the C8 Z06 or ZR1. Not that the C7 versions of those cars are a slouch. But the C8 is on another level.

# C7 Reason #4 – Plenty of Performance

Sure, the C7 Stingray, Z06 and ZR1 are slower than their C8 counterparts. But that doesn't mean the C7 is slow. Not by a long shot. The C7 offers plenty of performance today and we expect plenty for those in the year 2054. If you are driving a C7 Stingray 30 years from now, you will not be a rolling roadblock. So, just because the C8 has the edge, the C7 has plenty of grunt to hold its own and impress future collectors with old school power.

# C8 Reason #4 – First AWD/Hybrid

We are nearly certain that the E-Ray will not be the last AWD or Hybrid Corvette. But it is the first. And as future iterations of it are released, collectors may be interested in grabbing the C8 E-Ray that started it all. In 2054 the E-Ray technology will probably seem rudimentary, but it is still the start of something new. A 1957 Corvette with fuel injection is a prized collectible today because it featured a new technology. Fuel injection became far more advanced in the subsequent years, but there is always something special about the first one.

# C7 Reason #5 - Less Weight/Smaller Size

The C8 got a bit, um how do we say this? Well, it got big. It has the performance edge over the C7 as we already mentioned. But still, there is something more honest and purer about a smaller and lighter car. The C8 Stingray is 5.3



inches longer and 2.2 inches wider than the C7 Stingray. The C8 also weighs about 200 pounds more. Does the C7 feel more like a sports car and the C8 more like a GT car? That argument can be made. And in the future as cars get even bigger and heavier, people might find the simpler and smaller C7 more endearing.

# C8 Reason #5 – Last Stingray Without Electrification

This is not written in stone, but it is likely that the C8 Corvette is the last generation to feature a Stingray model without electrification. If future collectors want the last of the pure internal combustion engine powered cars, they are going to want the C8. Sure, the C7 has them too, but the C8 could be the last. And the last of something is almost always more valuable.

We have to wait 30 years to see if our predictions hold any water. In the meantime, we suggest you just buy whatever Corvette you like the most and drive it. The real value of these cars comes from driving them, not hoping they increase in value.





# Porsche Backs Down from EV...

During a Q&A session in its Q3 sales call, Porsche CFO Lutz Meschke said that the company is seeing a "slowdown in the BEV transition and the customer demand is not satisfying overall," and that many of Porsche's customers, and those in the luxury segment more broadly, are "looking in the direction of combustion engine cars."

Porsche, being a company whose primary goal is to sell cars and turn a profit, will cater to this demand. Meschke and the Porsche executive team are giving the company's R&D department the green light to work on combustion-powered

derivatives of EVs. BMW recently said its EV platform would also host combustion-powered models, and it sounds like Porsche is working in the same vein.

However, much of Porsche's upcoming product is already deep into the development process, and pumping the brakes on cars like the Macan, Boxster, and Cayman likely isn't a possibility. The Cayenne, meanwhile, will keep its V8 until

2030, and the 911 should stay gas-powered for as long as Porsche can make it work from a regulatory point of view.
