

Corvette Facts...Did You Know....

In 1973, aluminium wheels were again listed as an option. However, their inability to maintain air pressure (much like the problems which plagued the early 1963 aluminum knock off wheels), kept them out of the hands of customers until 1976.

The rear tire mirror in the 1974 Corvette was increased to a width of 10 inches.

The last true dual exhaust was installed in 1974. After that, all exhaust gases were channeled through a single catalytic converter.

The "big block engine" made it's final curtain call in the 1974 Corvette



Our feature Chevy Corvette Z06

may be one of the lowest-mile examples extant, it has had just three owners from new, and shows fewer than 5,400 documented miles from new. One of just 199 1963 Corvette Z06s produced, it is finished in brilliant Sebring Silver metallic over Saddle Tan leather, and powered by the 360-horsepower 327 Small Block fed by Rochester mechanical fuel injection. It is Bloomington Gold certified, and has been featured in several Bloomington Gold Special Collections in addition to being a Bloomington Gold Great Hall Inductee. This Corvette Z06 is the only known copy finished in Sebring Silver over Saddle Tan hides, and is optioned with a radio and blackwall tires. This Chevy Corvette Z06 crossed the auction block at the 2022 Gooding & Co. Amelia Island auction, trading hands for \$1,242,500 inclusive of fees.

Corvette Production Halted on C8's...

Production is expected to resume Monday, March 28th. The exact component currently in short supply was not identified, however, according to GM spokesperson Dan Flores, the Chevy Corvette C8 production downtime is not related to the ongoing global microchip shortage. Flores also indicated that no other GM plants had halted production as a result of parts shortages this week. The GM Bowling Green facility in Kentucky is the exclusive producer of the C8 Corvette. The facility has served as the exclusive producer of the Corvette nameplate since 1981.

In terms of sales, the C8 Corvette continues to dominate the Premium Sports Car segment in the U.S. Last year, General Motors sold 33,041 units of the Chevy Corvette C8, up nearly 53 percent compared to the 21,626 units sold in 2020. The next-closest rival was the Porsche 911, which sold 10,042 units in 2021.

Looking ahead, the 2023 model year is set to introduce the new go-faster C8 Corvette Z06, which will boast the naturally aspirated 5.5L V8 LT6 gasoline engine, rated at 670 horsepower and 460 pound-feet of torque.

Meanwhile, the C8 Corvette Stingray is equipped with the naturally aspirated <u>6.2L V8 LT2</u> gasoline engine, rated at 490 horsepower and 465 pound-feet of torque. Both models ride on the GM Y2 platform.

First Z06 Sells at Barrett Jackson Palm Beach...

The Z06 is a racinginspired version of the Corvette with a 670 hp V8 that makes it the most powerful vehicle in Chevrolet's lineup.


