Corvette Racing at Laguna SECA: C8.R No 4 Wins...

MONTEREY, Calif. (Sept. 12, 2021) –

Tommy Milner and Nick Tandy won for Corvette Racing in the GT Le Mans (GTLM) category of the IMSA

SportsCar Championship on Sunday, the first victory for the No. 4 Mobil 1/SiriusXM Chevrolet Corvette C8.R since Detroit in June.

It also marked Corvette Racing's first victory at WeatherTech Raceway Laguna SECA since 2014. Sunday's race marked 23 consecutive years of the program competing at the famed circuit near the Monterey Peninsula.

C8 2021 Production Numbers Announced...

A total of 26,212 examples of the 2021 <u>Corvette</u> Stingray were produced at the <u>GM Bowling Green</u> <u>Assembly</u> plant in Kentucky this year. That's up nearly 6,000 units from last year, when GM managed to build 20,368 units of the mid-engine sports car. Production of the 2021 Corvette Stingray began last December and lasted through to



September 6th, 2021. Production of the 2022 Corvette will begin on September 14th.

GM managed to build more than 26,000 examples of the 2021 Corvette Stingray despite production setbacks related to parts shortages. The automaker also <u>stopped taking new sold orders</u> for the 2021 model year in the Spring due to overwhelming demand. Tony Johnson, director of car and crossover marketing for <u>Chevy</u>, told <u>GM Authority</u> the automaker is <u>"not even close"</u> to meeting demand for the C8 Corvette Stingray and that it currently has "more orders than we can handle."

The 2022 Corvette will continue with the same naturally aspirated <u>6.2L</u> <u>LT2 V8</u> engine and eight-speed dual-clutch transmission, although the engine has received revised engine management calibration and a retuned <u>Active Fuel Management</u> system for 2022, mildly improving its fuel efficiency and emissions. Nevertheless, it will still produce 495 horsepower and 470 pound-feet of torque when equipped with the optional performance exhaust. The 2022 model will also introduce a new IMSA GTLM Championship Edition, which pays homage to the <u>Corvette</u> <u>C8.R</u> race car's dominant performance during the 2020 IMSA season, as well as <u>three new exterior colors</u> in the way of Hypersonic Gray, Caffeine, and Amplify Orange Tintcoat.

Chevy has plans to expand the C8 Corvette model range for the following 2023 model year. It will unveil the highly-anticipated $\frac{206}{200}$ launching later this year as a 2023 model, which will be followed shortly after by the hybrid <u>Corvette E-Ray</u>.

GM Loses Production on 800,000 Vehicles???

According to data from Autoforecast Solutions cited by <u>Automotive News</u>, the chip shortage has reduced GM's global production output this year by 777,928 vehicles this year. While almost all of the automaker's plants have felt the impact of the chip shortage to some degree, <u>GM Fairfax Assembly</u> in Kansas has been the hardest hit. The facility, which



produces the <u>Cadillac XT4</u> crossover and <u>Chevy Malibu</u> sedan, has remained dark since February, although XT4 production is <u>set to return</u> <u>on September 20th</u>. It's not clear when production of the <u>Chevy</u> Malibu will return, although GM has already cut 96,001 production units of the Malibu so far this year.

GM has maintained adequate output of its ever-important pickup truck models by implementing creative production solutions. Some of its pickups are being built without certain technologies, <u>Active Fuel</u> <u>Management, Dynamic Fuel Management</u> or <u>HD Radio</u>. It has also implemented a <u>"build shy" strategy</u> at its truck and SUV plants, which entails partially completing production of vehicles, storing them in a lot nearby and bringing them back into the plant once it receives the semiconductor chips it needs to finish them. Despite these efforts, it is still facing periodic shutdowns at its truck and SUV plants, which include <u>Flint Assembly</u> in Michigan, <u>Fort Wayne Assembly</u> in Indiana, <u>Silao</u> <u>Assembly</u> in Mexico and <u>Arlington Assembly</u> in Texas.

AN says GM has implemented special software tools to help dealers cope with reduced inventory levels. One of the programs includes a dashboard that places vehicle trim options side-by-side with market data, allowing dealers to see which vehicles are in highest demand in their area to ensure they are making the most of their limited production allocations. Another program called VinView allows dealers to track a vehicle's order status and provide updates to the buyer on when their vehicle will be delivered.

Many experts predict the chip shortage will persist throughout 2021 and well into 2022 as demand continues to outweigh production output. Some experts have said the shortage could even <u>last into 2023</u>.

C8 Corvette Gets Stolen Off Dealer Lot...

A <u>Chevy</u> salesman in Virginia was left dismayed after the customer they were serving got behind the wheel of a <u>C8 Corvette</u> <u>Stingray</u> display model and drove it off the lot without permission.



A video of the incident was uploaded to a

Facebook fan page called <u>C8 Corvette Owners and Friends</u> this week.

According to the original Facebook post, this harebrained car thief only drove about a mile or so before they were caught. The vehicle was later returned to the dealership without incident. It's not clear if the person was arrested after this little stunt. It's also not clear if the sports car had already been sold and the customer was waiting to take delivery, or if the dealership was still seeking a buyer for it.

Another commenter said the customer only wanted to get in the vehicle to check out the interior and did not mention taking the vehicle for a test drive. The salesperson was about to join them in the passenger seat of the vehicle, but the thief then started the vehicle up and began driving away.

This is the second viral mishap involving a Chevy dealer and C8 Corvette Stingray in recent weeks. Last month, a Chevy dealer went viral after a service person was <u>caught joyriding and street racing a customer's C8 Corvette Stingray</u> by the onboard Performance Data Recorder camera system. The dealership has <u>since offered to replace the customer's car</u> with a new 2022 Corvette Stingray.

Convertibles Accounted For 42 Percent Of 2021...

Speaking during a recent presentation at the National Corvette Museum, <u>Chevrolet</u> <u>Corvette</u> and <u>Camaro</u> Product Marketing Manager Harlan Charles revealed the final production numbers for the 2021 Corvette Stingray. According to Charles, about 42



percent of 2021 Corvette Stingray orders were for the Convertible body style. Of these convertibles, 8 percent were ordered in the 1LT trim level, 40 percent were ordered in the 2LT trim level and 52 percent were ordered in the range-topping 3LT trim. Additionally, 35 percent also opted for the contrast painted roof, while a further 9 percent went for the painted Nacelles.

"If you look at the Convertible, it's up to 42 percent and climbing," Charles said during the presentation. "I think [for the 2022 model year] so far it's up to 45. I think we'll get to the point where the majority ends up being Convertible one of these days. Both are great cars, but I think with the retractable hardtop and the benefits, people are starting to see those."

As we reported previously, Chevy produced 26,212 examples of the 2021 Corvette Stingray – up from 20,368 units in 2020. Chevy will likely build even more 2022 Corvettes, as this year's production run was still fraught with setbacks due to parts shortages. Tony Johnson, director of car and crossover marketing for Chevy, told *GM Authority* previously the automaker is <u>"not even close"</u> to meeting demand for the <u>C8</u> Corvette Stingray and that it currently has "more orders than we can handle."

GM began producing the 2022 Corvette Stingray <u>on the week of</u> <u>September 6th, 2021</u>. The 3D visualizer for the mid-engine sports car went live in August, while the build your own tool (which includes full pricing) will go live on September 14th at <u>Chevrolet.com</u>.

C8 Tops J.D. Power 2021 Quality Study...

The <u>Chevy Corvette Stingray C8</u> was rated the best Premium Sporty Car in the <u>2021 J.D. Power</u> <u>U.S. Initial Quality Study</u>.

The Chevy <u>Corvette</u> Stingray beat out two of its closest rivals to top its category in the annual J.D. Power Study – the Porsche



718 and the Lexus LC. The Porsche 911, long considered the most direct rival to the <u>Chevy</u> Corvette, is notably absent from the top three.

The J.D. Power Initial Quality Study is conducted by surveying new vehicle owners on the number of problems they experienced during the first 90 days of ownership, per 100 vehicles. A lower score means fewer problems were experienced and is thus indicative of a higher quality. The industry average score in this year's edition of the annual study was 162, with 20 of 32 brands improving their quality from last year's study. The survey is based on the responses from 110,827 purchasers and lessees of new 2021 model-year vehicles, who answered 223 questions with regard to vehicle quality split into nine vehicle categories. These included infotainment, features, controls and displays, exterior, driving assistance, interior, powertrain, seats, driving experience and climate. The study was fielded from February through July 2021.

A high initial quality score for the C8 Corvette Stingray means owners are experiencing minimal problems with the vehicle early in their ownership. Common problems experienced early with new vehicles include infotainment bugs, smartphone/Bluetooth connectivity issues and loose/squeaky trim pieces. One in four of all problems cited by new-vehicle owners are in the infotainment category, J.D. Power says, and six of the top 10 problems across the industry are infotainment-related.

J.D. Power says the addition of wireless versions of Apple CarPlay and Android Auto has made these connectivity/infotainment issues even more common.

"The top complaint this year is Android Auto/Apple CarPlay connectivity, which worsens significantly," the research agency said. "This is a particular problem when these systems are operated wirelessly, which is increasingly common."

The <u>2022 Corvette Stingray</u> will enter production at the <u>GM Bowling Green</u> <u>Assembly</u> plant on September 6th, introducing <u>minor changes</u> like <u>new exterior</u> <u>colors</u> and a <u>new low rear spoiler</u>.

C8's sell 102% of MSRP...

The <u>C8 Corvette Stingray</u> is undoubtedly one of the hottest new cars on the market right now, with eager fans buying up every available unit just about <u>as</u> <u>quickly as they become</u> <u>available</u>. Unsurprisingly, the



new <u>C8 Corvette Stingray</u> has been identified as one model that's consistently selling above MSRP.

According to a recent report from <u>Autotrader</u>, the new C8 Corvette Stingray is selling, on average, at 102 percent of MSRP. Autotrader recently compiled a list of 20 new vehicles consistently selling above the full retail price, placing the new Corvette Stingray in 15th place underneath the Ford Bronco and above the Toyota Tacoma, both of which are also selling at an average of 102 percent of MSRP.

At the top of the *Autotrader* list is the Mercedes-Benz G-Class, which is selling at 118 percent of MSRP, followed by the Kia Telluride at 108 percent of MSRP and the Kia Carnival at 107 percent of MSRP.

Several other General Motors models also made the list, including the <u>Chevy Bolt EUV</u> in 20th at 100.5 percent of MSRP, the <u>GMC Yukon</u> XL in 19th at 101 percent of MSRP, and, as *GM Authority* covered previously, the <u>Cadillac Escalade</u> in 8th at <u>104 percent of MSRP</u>.

As covered previously, dealers around the country have been marking up the C8 Corvette Stingray in response to soaring demand and low supply. However, it's likely that those C8 Corvette Stingray markups should begin to go away now, as General Motors has shifted away from an historic dealer allocation model, which allocates supply based on how many models a dealer has sold, to an <u>Available Day Supply dealer</u> <u>allocation model</u>, which prioritizes the rapidity with which a model is sold, incentivizing lower pricing to move units more quickly.
