In 1988, Corvette started using a unidirectional 17" wheel.

Approximately 80 ZR-1 Corvettes were built in 1989, but none were sold to the public! The last of these ZR-1s were

shipped out off the factory on Dec.22, 1988. Most probably became collector cars bought at inflated prices and in personal car collections!

The FX3 adjustable suspension option, permitting shock valving changes via a rotary dial mounted on the interior console between the seats, was first introduced in 1989.



ZO6 Wins Car & Driver Track Test...

2023 Corvette Z06 Wins Car and Driver's 2023 Lightning Lap Competition.

Built to dominate at the track, that's precisely what the 2023 Corvette Z06 did in this long-running competition.



The 2023 Corvette Z06 has garnered all kinds of praise since its launch, proving to live up to the immense hype that preceded it – not an easy task by any means. The latest Z06 is a true beast of a performance car that's equally capable of accelerating rapidly in a straight line and carving up corners on the track, and as such, everyone knew that it was going to be a bit of a ringer at *Car and Driver's* annual Lighting Lap competition, which pits a whole bunch of new vehicles against each other at Virginia International Raceway to test their prowess. And that's precisely what it did at the 2023 version of this long-running test.

It's not that the 2023 Corvette Z06 faced a group of cream puff competitors, either — this year's lineup included cars like the Lamborghini Huracán Tecnica, Porsche 718 Cayman GT4 RS, and BMW C4 CSL, to name just a few. There were also a host of far less expensive machines like the newest Honda Civic Type R, Toyota GR Corolla, and BMW i4 M50, but let's be honest — they're fun, but featherweights compared to cars like the 2023 Corvette Z06.

When the dust settled, the Z06 – which is fully loaded in this case, with the Z07 package and carbon fiber goodies – managed a best lap time of 2:38.6, which topped every single entrant in this year's Lightning Lap. However, what's even more impressive about that figure is that it's also the fifth fastest lap in the event's entire history – which has taken place at VIR since 2006 – and it's also the fastest lap for any naturally-aspirated vehicle at LL, ever.

Needless to say, the *C&D* crew came away mighty impressed!!

'56 Duntov Special...

Uncovering an original-owner 1956 Corvette is reason enough to rejoice, but this '56 is one of 111 built with option codes 469, 2x4 carburetors on a 265ci, and 449, Duntov special high-lift cam that raised output to 240 horsepower.



"I had to buy the whole estate to get the car," Bob Kunz said.

Kunz, who is famous for rebuilding carburetors says he "got a pile of paperwork" with the Vette to document Chevrolet's famous option code "449" of 1956. "I've got the order sheet, invoice, title and warranty paperwork."

Chevrolet introduced #449 "for racing purposes only," priced at \$188.30 plus the \$172.20 cost of the 225-horsepower, 2x4 265ci V-8. The sum of \$360.50 was more than 10 percent of the base cost of a '56 Corvette; not small change in the mid-1950s. "The original owner kept a record of every gas purchase from the time he bought the car new until the day he stored it in his basement garage in 1983 and never drove the car again,"

"I threw \$100,000 at them. It was actually a little more than \$100,000. That was a Tuesday morning." To Bob's surprise, when he got home the next day he found a message on his answering machine. The court had accepted his offer. Bob was in for a bigger surprise when he paid for the estate. Shirley handed him "all this paperwork."

Now in his 70s, Bob Kunz still rebuilds carburetors for clients. A multiple carbureted '56 Corvette was a perfect match for him. He has decided to hang onto the '56 to drive and enjoy.






Corvette History...

Along with the hybrid trans/differential unit or "transaxle", the Firebird II housed one of the company's earliest application of a four-wheel independent suspension, a feature that would be used to great effect in Chevy's flagship sports car starting in 1963. And while it would take another 34 years for a transaxle to find its way into a production Corvette, the configuration worked so well on the '97-04 C5 that it was carried over to the C6 and C7 generations that followed.

The Firebird II may not garner much attention these days among Corvette- history buffs, but considering that two of its engineering innovations ultimately became mainstays of the Corvette. So, lets give the car its due!

Chevy Reveals Sleek Electric Sedan...


GM President Mark Reuss mentioned a large car with a "dramatic low-roof, sedan-like proportion" that was in the works for China. However, at GM's Tech Day China event the following week, a concept called the FNR-XE was revealed. Chevy has whittled its current U.S. lineup down to one internal combustion engine

model, the Malibu. Things are different in China, where sedans are still popular and several can be found in Chevy's showrooms, and there are apparently more on the way.



GM Approved Mid-Engine Corvette Back in 2007.....

GM unveiled the mid-engine
Corvette C8 for the 2020 model
year, making a giant leap in terms
of performance and engineering
for the iconic sports car
nameplate. However, according to
former GM vice chairman Bob
Lutz, The General had actually
approved the development of a



production-spec mid-engine Corvette as far back as 2007.

According to Lutz, the idea centered around whether or not GM "had the money." The former GM exec states that, at the time, the mid-engine Corvette design was "smoother" and more "angular" than the current mid-engine Corvette C8, something akin to a Ferrari or McLaren. However, Lutz says the program was canned "because it was an all-new architecture, came up to around \$900 million. Well, when bankruptcy was imminent, chapter 11 was imminent, a lot of programs had to be stricken, and that was one of them."

As a result GM, opted to reduce the Corvette capital investment budget to basically "zero" and continue to produce the C6 Corvette for "quite a while longer." Lutz continues by saying that once additional funds were available to once again develop the Corvette, the C7 came out with a longer wheelbase "for better balance." Lutz calls the C7 a "similar, but much more-capable car than the C6."

Following the traditional pattern of model releases for the C7 Corvette, from the base model, to the Z06, to the Grand Sport, to the ZR1, GM finally got around to releasing the mid-engine Corvette C8. However, if funding didn't dry up, Lutz estimates that a mid-engine Corvette may have been released as early as 2011 or 2012.

Of course, it bears mentioning that the essential idea of mid-engine Corvette is certainly much older than all of this, with decades of history to point to, all the way back to the "Father of the Corvette," Zora Arkus-Duntov. Even so, it's interesting to think about what may have been had GM escaped bankruptcy.

Only in California??

The internet has been buzzing about a Hyundai customer, and their situation involving a traffic stop. California is known for being unnecessarily strict on modified vehicles.



However, in these

examples no modifications were made.

There is a dash cam video of the stop where the officer claims that it is illegal to run track modes with any vehicle on a California public road. This has caused some outrage in the comments of posts like this. No one can quite understand how a legally registered sports sedan that is 50-state smog approved can fall under this kind of scrutiny. There was no warning displayed that states that the specified sportier drive mode is for track-use only.

One driver of a 2022 Hyundai Elantra N-Line recently received a citation for driving in track mode, which Hyundai has dubbed "N Mode".

A similar story about a Chevy Camaro SS owner purchased the vehicle, and that it was bone stock! Though, to be clear, the law only addresses driving with modified exhausts as being illegal. In both these cases, the car's exhaust systems were stock. But with the valves open in sport/track mode, the exhausts do get louder. It should be no surprise that the car passed smog with flying colors. Unfortunately, the noise level in the N mode continued to fail.

Well, we have found there is no law in California regarding the use of track or sport modes on the street. We looked up the codes in this driver's citation. Both codes point to a non-compliant exhaust. The problem is that manufacturers are having their cars tested without the use of these sport/track modes. That way they pass for sale to the public, and the customer has to take to responsibility afterwards. To avoid legal issues with their customers, maybe the manufacturers should add a disclaimer that pops up when these more aggressive drive modes are activated.

Microsoft Computers Compared to Cars!!!


