



Bowling Green Plant Getting Help...

General Motors' <u>Bowling Green</u> <u>Assembly</u> plant was <u>damaged</u> <u>after a tornado touched down</u> in Kentucky last weekend, forcing the automaker to temporarily close the facility until the necessary repairs can be made.



The plant, which is the only facility

that builds the <u>C8 Corvette Stingray</u>, may come back online sooner than expected thanks to help from the automaker's <u>Factory Zero</u> and <u>Spring</u> <u>Hill</u> plants. According to <u>The Detroit Free Press</u>, the automaker has moved construction cranes from the Factory Zero and Spring Hill construction sites to Bowling Green to help assist with the post-tornado repairs. Some building material was also moved from Factory Zero to Kentucky this week.

Jason Watson, president of the UAW Local 2164 branch that represents Bowling Green Assembly plant workers, told *The Detroit Free Press* that GM is first focusing on performing exterior repairs to the plant before turning its attention to some of the interior damage that occurred. The automaker confirmed Monday the plant had suffered roof damage and a small fire, while an employee entrance was also left in disrepair.

"There's all kinds of visible damage throughout the building and structural things," Watson told the newspaper. "The building itself is what they're trying to concentrate on because there are multiple areas of the roof that were compromised and various siding surrounding the plant. They can't determine yet if there's damage to equipment or line, they're not turning it on yet."

GM is currently performing major renovations at Factory Zero as it converts the site to a dedicated EV production facility. Similarly, Spring Hill is undergoing major renovations to prepare for production of the <u>Cadillac Lyriq</u> and perhaps a <u>future Acura electric crossover</u> as well. It's unclear when production of the C8 Corvette Stingray will restart at Bowling Green Assembly, however a spokesperson said the production shutdown is so far only in place for this week.

115 Corvette Stingray Damaged Beyond Repair....

115 C8 <u>Corvette</u> Stingray were damaged beyond repair in the tornadoes and must be scrapped. Dealers who placed customer orders for cars affected by this turn of events will need to resubmit their order. GM says that allocation numbers for the next round of 2022 Corvette orders appear to not have been negatively



affected, so dealers will be able to place new orders according to last week's order numbers.

Unfortunately, the 115 cars that were damaged whilst sitting inside the plant may not be the only cars that will be scrapped. The memo says Corvettes that were sitting outside in the back of the factory awaiting shipping are still being assessed for damage. These vehicles are currently being held by the plant and will not be shipped to dealers until a full assessment is completed.

GM was already struggling to keep up with demand for the C8 Corvette Stingray and this unfortunate turn of events will likely delay deliveries of the 2022 Corvette even further. Production at the GM Bowling Green Assembly plant is also paused this week as the automaker assesses the damage done to the plant, which included roof damage and a minor amount of fire damage.

"Maintaining a safe work environment for plant employees is our top priority," a plant spokesperson said this week. "Therefore, we are cancelling production on first and second shift the week of December 13th as our trained teams work to get tooling, equipment, and the facility space up to standard."

The GM Bowling Green Assembly plant employs 1,200 hourly workers and 180 salaried workers. Hourly workers there are represented by UAW Local 2164.

The <u>GM Bowling Green Assembly</u> plant, the exclusive assembly plant for the <u>C8 Corvette Stingray</u>, will re-open next week after it was idled <u>due to</u> <u>damage sustained from a tornado</u>.

NCM Spared and NCM Motorsports Park Damage....

During the historic storms on December 11, 2021, the National Corvette Museum was spared any significant damage. All staff - National Corvette Museum, NCM Motorsports



Park, and NCM Insurance - were reported as safe.

Fifteen hours after the events, the curatorial team verified that all the artifacts and vehicles in the collection were reported secure. Thirty-six hours after the storm, all individuals with an artifact on loan to the Museum were notified that their loaned items were not in harm's way.

While much of the storm damage was isolated to the Museum's Amphitheater, the Museum was closed over the weekend while crews restored power, cleared roadways of debris, and ensured that our areas were safe once again. We appreciate the calls, e-mails, and check-ins on our staff and institutions.

Our closure was necessary due to the circumstances, but we apologize for any inconvenience you may have encountered and appreciate your patience as we work through this unprecedented situation.

Unfortunately, the NCM Motorsports Park did not have the same fate as the Museum. The Motorsports Park is temporarily unsafe to welcome guests, and all activities are suspended until further notice. Insurance adjusters and crews have begun the assessment and clean-up efforts to help determine our rebuilding plan of the affected areas.

2023 Z06's On Route to GM Proving Grounds...

A <u>Chevy</u> dealer representative took a few snapshots of a truckload of <u>2023</u> <u>Corvette</u> <u>Z06</u> units loaded onto a car hauler this week, giving us some of the first real-world photos of the new mid-engine supercar without any camouflage applied to it.



These <u>Corvette</u> Z06 units are not being dropped at the dealership the rep works at, as customer deliveries of the vehicle will not begin until next year. Instead, these cars are allegedly headed to the <u>GM Milford Proving Ground</u> in Michigan.

These <u>2023 Corvette</u> Z06 units will no doubt spend some time on the socalled 'Lutz Ring at Milford – a 2.9-mile, 17-turn road course that was designed specifically to push a vehicle's powertrain, suspension and brakes to the absolute limit. The Lutz Ring, as the name suggests, is the brainchild of former GM chairman Bob Lutz, who wanted a racetrack that emulated sections of some of the world's most challenging racetracks to help improve the handling and ride comfort of GM vehicles.

Engineers are also sure to have a bit of fun with the new <u>C8 Corvette Z06</u> at Milford. After all, the supercar is powered by a naturally aspirated <u>5.5L LT6</u> <u>V8</u>, which produces a healthy 670 horsepower and 460 pound-feet of torque, with the redline set at a sky-high 8,600 rpm. Output is routed rearwards through an eight-speed dual-clutch transmission, enabling it to hustle from zero to 60 mph in about 2.7 seconds.

A handful of these prototypes also appear to be equipped with the available Z07 Performance Package, which enhances the performance ceiling of the 2023 Corvette Z06 with aerodynamic add-ons, sticker Sport Cup 2 R ZP tires, a more robust performance braking setup with carbon ceramic rotors and FE7 suspension with specific calibrations for the <u>Magnetic Ride Control</u> 4.0 dampers. Models equipped with the Z07 Performance Package can also be equipped with lightweight carbon fiber wheels (shown on the Arctic White-painted model above) – which significantly reduce the vehicle's unsprung mass to improve steering responsiveness and handling.

Radar Detector Could Damage C8 Rearview Mirror....

Radar detectors are a popular aftermarket modification among sports car owners for what should be fairly obvious reasons, but <u>C8 Corvette Stingray</u> owners could run into a small problem when u s i n q a r a d a r



detector in their vehicles, as indicated by a recent post on the *GM TechLink* website.

The article says some C8 <u>Corvette</u> Stingray owners have complained that their driver-side outside mirror displayed a poor operation and appearance, including numerous lines shown in the mirror and a dim reflection at all times. This problem has been traced back to the installation of an aftermarket radar detector, which, depending on the installation location, may send a higher voltage to the mirror.

This problem is caused when the jumper harness for the aftermarket radar detector is added to the mirror's X1 connector, which is located behind the front cover of the inside rearview mirror.

If a customer experiences this problem, technicians will disconnect the

jumper harness and replace

the damaged outside rearview mirror. Vehicle damage resulting from aftermarket devices is not covered under warranty, so owners should be cognizant of this before plugging a radar detector into any of the vehicle's ports.



Corvette Eight-Speed Transmission Production to Ontario Canada Q2 2022....

Production of the <u>mid-engine Chevy</u> <u>Corvette</u> C8's eight-speed dual-clutch transmission will begin at the <u>GM St.</u> <u>Catherines plant</u> in Ontario, Canada in Q2 of the 2022 calendar year, *GM Authority* has learned from sources familiar with the matter.



Earlier in November, *GM Authority* reported that the GM St. Catherines plant would manufacture the <u>Chevrolet Corvette</u> C8's eight-speed dual-clutch transmission following ratification of a labor contract between General Motors and Canadian labor union, UNIFOR. In order to produce the <u>C8 Corvette</u> eight-speed dual-clutch transmission, GM will invest \$109 million into the GM St. Catherines facility. The money will also go towards support for "continued V8 engine production."

Also known as St. Catharines Propulsion, St. Catharines Powertrain, or St. Catharines engine plant, the GM St. Catherines plant first opened in 1954, and is located in St. Catharines, Ontario, Canada. The facility also produces the GF6 six-speed automatic transmission, as well as the naturally aspirated <u>5.3L</u> <u>L84 V8</u> gasoline engine and naturally aspirated <u>6.2L L87 V8</u> gasoline engine.

Going forward, General Motors will take over production of the mid-engine <u>Chevy</u> Corvette C8's eight-speed dual-clutch transmission from Tremec. Based in Wixom, Michigan, with production facilities in Mexico and Belgium, Tremec is the current manufacturer of the Corvette's DCT.

As a reminder, the C8 Chevy Corvette is offered with two engine specs, including the naturally aspirated <u>6.2L V8 LT2</u> gasoline engine, which is equipped by the <u>C8 Corvette Stingray</u>, and the naturally aspirated <u>5.5L V8 LT6</u> gasoline engine, which is equipped by the <u>C8 Corvette Z06</u>. Both models are equipped with the eight-speed dual-clutch transmission, and both ride on the GM Y2 platform. Both vehicles are also assembled at the <u>GM Bowling Green</u> <u>Assembly facility</u> in Bowling Green, Kentucky. The C8 Corvette Stingray is available now, while the C8 Corvette Z06 will go on sale in 2022 for the 2023 model year.

New Continental Tires Ad Features C8 Corvette ...

A new advertisement from Continental uses the <u>C8 Corvette</u> Stingray to promote the German tire manufacturer's products.

This ad features a C8 <u>Corvette</u> Stingray finished in the Long Beach Red Tintcoat exterior color, which was offered for the 2020 model year before it was replaced by



Red Mist Tintcoat on the 2021 Corvette. The advertisement shows the vehicle driving on an empty countryside road before showing clips of the mid-engine sports car driving slowly in a town center.

C8 Corvette Convertible in Long Beach Red

Strangely, the C8 Corvette Stingray does not come from the factory with Continental brand tires. The mid-engine sports car is equipped with <u>Michelin</u> <u>tires exclusively</u>, including the standard Michelin Pilot Sport All Season 4 allseason and the optional Michelin Pilot Sport 4S summer tire. Both of these tires were developed by Michelin specifically for the C8 Corvette Stingray.

The only Continental Tire product that currently fits the original wheel sizes of the C8 Corvette Stingray is the Continental SportContact 6. This set of rubber, which unlike the factory tires is not a run-flat, is described by Continental as an "ultra high-performance tire," that is "designed to meet the demands of the most powerful and sportiest vehicles."

While Continental is not the factory tire supplier for the C8 Corvette Stingray, the company <u>partnered with American tuning company</u> <u>Lingenfelter</u> to promote its tuning program for the sports car last fall. Lingenfelter released videos and photos of a tuned C8 Corvette Stingray finished in a Continental Tire livery (above) and wearing a set of the company's ExtremeContact Sport rubber, which were installed on a set of aftermarket alloy wheels. These tires do not fit the factory wheel sizes for the mid-engine Corvette, so aftermarket wheels would be required to install them.

Porsche Working On Ruggedized Porsche 911?...

An odd-looking Porsche 911 prototype was recently spotted testing in Germany which begs the question – should Chevy follow suit with a ruggedized variant of the Corvette?



This particular prototype appears to be equipped with a raised suspension, greater ground clearance, taller tires, and flared wheel arches. While the 'Ring might seem like a strange place to test the off-roading variant of *any* vehicle, odds are an off-roader 911 would still spend most of its life on paved roads anyway.

Which brings us to Chevrolet. There's no doubt that off-road models are as popular as ever these days, with a long list of trail-ready vehicles on offer across the crossover, SUV, and pickup truck segments. The recently introduced GMC Sierra AT4X and Chevy Silverado ZR2 certainly come to mind. So then – what about a ruggedized Chevy Corvette?

The nameplate has already evolved massively with the introduction of the mid-engine C8, and rumor has it a further evolution is in store down the road. Way back in 2018, *GM Authority* captured a potential Corvette crossover undergoing testing, while in September of January of 2020, we risked backlash from the purists by publishing renderings of what a

Corvette SUV might look like like. Early this year, rumor that GM was working on an allelectric Corvette crossover once again rekindled the rather controversial subject.

It Takes Some Guts To Chop A Brand New C8 Corvette And Make A C8 Art Deco-Inspired Custom Build...

The art of coachbuilding has taken a downturn since unibody construction conquered the automotive world. But some people are still out there doing it old school.

Just because what's happening is fairly clear, doesn't mean that it's easy to understand, though. The artisan coachbuilder is turning a brand new C8 Corvette into a unique creation that's partly inspired by what a C2 Corvette would look liked had Chevy chosen a mid-engine layout in the 1960s and partly from the Art Deco movement, which may give some onlookers pause.



Obviously, that's not an easy task as the eighth-generation car places its engine in the middle, rather than in the front, as Chevy opted to do for the second-generation of its most famous sports car. Ignore the fact that even the attempts to turn late-model front-engine Corvettes into older model lookalikes aren't always really that successful. And worry not about production delays for people who actually want to drive their C8 as is; the world needs nuts like Jack Wendel to make oddball cars and to keep car culture weird.


The concept, though odd, isn't completely mad. Mid-engine vehicles from the '60s, such as the the Lamborghini Miura, aka the OG supercar, were still very much interpreting that layout through the lens of long-hooded, front-engine design language and no one would call that car ugly. The proportional strictures of the C8 Corvette this creation is being based on may mean, though, that this DIY car is less universally-adored than Lamborghini's efforts.

Perhaps the most stunning aspect of this project, which the channel claims is being accomplished solely in the maker's spare time and will require no special equipment. In any case, we can't wait to see what the finished item will look like.


