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MAZDA CONFIRMS FIRST EV FOR U.S., AND IT'LL HAVE A ROTARY **ENGINE - MX-30**

It's official: Mazda's North American **Operations** president Jeff Guyton confirmed

that the brand's MX-30 crossover, originally bound only for Japan and Europe, will come to the U.S. as an electric vehicle with a rotary-engine range extender. "For the U.S. market," Guyton stated, "the range extender would be more appropriate."

"Mazda is committed to continuing to innovate and deliver an engaging driving experience. With that in mind, we can confirm we will bring our first electric vehicle, the MX-30, to the U.S. market. The vehicle will be available as both a fully electric model and a series plug-in-hybrid, featuring a rotary engine. Additional information about availability will be released at the appropriate time."

Mazda introduced the MX-30 at the 2019 Tokyo Auto Show. Though it rides on the

Turbocharged power has returned to the Mazda3 lineup for 2021, marking the first time since 2013

that Mazda has offered a turbo engine in its entry-level four-door model.

The Mazda3 continues to be a vehicle that sells incredibly well and is highly respected, winning its fair share of awards and accolades, including the World Car Design of the Year Award.

For 2021, Mazda is offering its SKYACTIV-G 2.5L Turbocharged engine on its top-tier GT trim. This now transforms the Mazda3, which is one of the best-looking vehicles in its class, into an entry luxe-performance vehicle. Or a sleek vehicle that has a welcomed mean streak when you hit the pedal.

Mazda has tweaked and fiddled with its trim levels over the years, with the GT tier now demanding the attention of buvers who are looking for premium features.



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same platform as the Mazda 3 and the CX-30, the MX-30 has a more rakish

profile than Mazda's other SUVs, as well as rear-hinged doors that remind us of the RX-8. The MX-30 EV's range is 124 miles on the European WLTP cycle, which explains the need for a range extender to lengthen its tether. Reportedly, Mazda is looking to double the MX-30 EV's range with rotary power.

This is an idea Mazda has been working on for some time—back in 2013 Mazda built a small number of Demio (Mazda2) EVs with a rotary-engine range extender. The Wankel engine's low-vibration characteristics ("Piston engine goes boing, boing, boing, but the Mazda goes Hmmmmm!") make it well suited to an electric car, as does its compact size, power density, and low weight. On the Demio EV, the whole package—including engine, generator, and a 2.6-gallon fuel tank—fit neatly under the trunk floor.

Mazda also has a "mild" hybrid version of the MX-30, which is already on sale in Japan and is built around the 2.0-liter "SkyActiv-G" engine. The MX-30 EV, meanwhile, will debut in Europe as a pure EV, and the range extender will follow in 2022. We do not yet know the specific timing for the U.S. model, though we'd be surprised if it's very far behind the European launch. And what about the mild-hybrid version? We think it'd make sense for Mazda's U.S. lineup, but Mazda says it has not been confirmed for any market outside of Japan.

WINTER DRIVING TIPS

The Mazda3 Turbo engine has 250 horses and up to 320 lb-ft of torque when you are fueling it with 93

Octane. Those figures drop to 227 horsepower and 310 lb-ft of torque when using 87 Octane. This is a significant performance upgrade when compared to the non-turbocharged Mazda3 option, which only makes 186 hp.

The power from the Turbo engine is palpable. Stomp the gas pedal and be prepared to definitely notice the difference in power, shooting off in a hurry.

Mazda's G-Vectoring Control Plus comes into play with Sport mode on. This results in smoother, more intuitive handling around corners, as it won't downshift midturn.

Mazda's i-Activ AWD system is standard, which distributes more torque to the rear wheels (up to three times more than the previous system, according to Mazda). The result is a drive that pulls you closer to the ground. A strong connection to the road is clearly felt, but without it becoming overbearing.



Mazda says they built the Mazda3 GT Turbo to be an everyday vehicle; one that you'll want to drive during your stop-and-

go commute and for your weekend getaway. With that in mind, they made the bold choice to not have a manual transmission. Or, perhaps it's the smart choice, with manual transmissions in major decline, and younger drivers caring about other features more than shifting gears. The rationale for a six-speed automatic is the same. More gears equals more shifts, which equals more interruptions to your drive. Less is more, in Mazda's eyes, resulting in a smoother experience.

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4. Warm Up to Driving - Tires perform at their worst when they are cold. This can get compounded by cold pavement. During the winter months, remember that the climate is cold; give a little extra distance when braking, especially until you have driven at least 15 miles to get some warmth into the tires.

5. Salt Doesn't Just Raise Your Blood Pressure - During the winter, there is a lot of salt dumped on the roads. This is great to help melt any ice that may be out there, but there are some additional dangers that you must keep in mind. Excessive areas of salt can actually reduce traction for your



car; think of it as loose gravel on the pavement. Salt is also corrosive for your car. Remember,

regular car washes are a lot cheaper than replacing your corroded exhaust!

6. When the Weather is Bad, The Timing is Good - It is VERY important to practice driving in bad weather. Of course, you may not want to do this in the first few weeks of driving, but you do want to ensure that you get plenty of practice in during all four seasons, and in every possible situation you can think of.
