

New Member Road Captain's Corner

A rider who plans to drop out should notify the lead and sweep riders of his or her intentions. If it is an emergency, vehicle trouble etc. be sure to use caution when leaving the formation. Risk involved in separating from the group is minimized by riding near the rear of the pack if it is a planned departure. Opinions vary as to whether or not the group should "re-stack" to eliminate the gap created by a departing motorcycle. If the gap is to be filled, each rider, in turn, should signal and carefully switch to the other line. The gap should never be eliminated by moving forward past the rider in the other line to the left or right.

Staggered Formation Riding

Below is the primary riding formation.

Single file is used when directed by the ride leader.

One-second rule: The bike in the lane to your left or right should not be

less than one second ahead of you.

Two-second rule: Maintain at least two seconds between you and the


rider in front of you.

Four-second rule: Look ahead four seconds at your immediate path of

travel to give yourself more time to react to a hazard.

Twelve-second rule: Also look ahead at your anticipated path of travel.

Twelve seconds is about one city block.


